Dear Mr. Fuller:

Mr. Park has told me that you are willing to come to Bennington College to speak to our student and faculty and that April twenty-ninth will be a convenient date for you. This meeting will be at 7:35 p.m. and will be followed by an informal discussion and question period. I believe you are familiar with the type of audience here. We hope that you will be our guest at the College for dinner before the lecture and for the night.

Our fee for these meetings is \$25. plus your traveling expenses from New York City. From New York you can get a train direct to North Bennington which leaves the Grand Central station at 8:30 a.m. and arrives here at 12:45 in time for lunch at the College. Or there are later trains to Albany where we should also be glad to have the College chauffeur meet you. The 11:00 a.m. train from the Grand Central station arrives in Albany at 2:03 p.m.; the 12:30 p.m. train gets into Albany at 3:42 p.m.; and the 1:45 p.m. train gets into Albany at 4:26 p.m. If you will let me know later which of these trains you find most convenient, I will arrange to have you met either at Albany or North Bennington. The drive from Albany to the college takes about an hour and a half.

Mr. Park tells me that you have some interesting comparative charts on the technology of copper. We hope very much that you will be willing to tell us something about these. As soon as you decide we should greatly appreciate hearing exactly what the subject of your talk will be in order that it may be announced.
